COVID-19 Stimulus Check Summary

- If you filed a 2018 or 2019 Tax Return, authorized the IRS to direct deposit your refund and didn't change your banking information, YOU DON'T NEED TO TAKE ANY ACTION. The stimulus funds will be automatically deposited.
- 2) If you filed a PAPER 2018 or 2019 Tax Return (didn't authorize direct deposit of the refund) and didn't change your mailing address, the stimulus fund check will be mailed to your home. However, it may take weeks or months for the check to arrive.
- 3) If you want to reduce the wait on the paper stimulus check, the process MAY be quicker by going to the IRS website (https://www.irs.gov/coronavirus/get-my-payment) and updating your banking information.
- 4) If you are required to file a tax return but haven't for 2018 or 2019, you must file a 2019 tax return to receive the payment.
- 5) If you haven't been required to file a return during the past two years, you may have to submit some information online before receiving the payment. You can initiate that process by going to the IRS website (https://www.irs.gov/coronavirus/non-filers-enter-payment-info-here).
